

BBC to let vacant White City space as “creative campus”

Developer TCN has partnered with the BBC to turn a 60,000 sq ft building in White City in west London into a workspace for creative industries.

With the UGLI project, which is being launched today, the BBC will convert the vacant property into “affordable and flexible” workspace for small creative businesses.

The Media Trust charity will be the first organisation to occupy the building, and will base 60 of its staff there.

TCN, which is working with JPCreative on branding the project, wants to use vacant BBC buildings in White City for similar schemes.

In December, the BBC appointed Lambert Smith Hampton to find a developer to redevelop Television Centre at White City after it finishes moving staff to Broadcasting House in London’s West End and Mediacity in Salford.

Government minister for the Creative Industries, Ed Vaizey, said: “This project will be a fantastic boost to the creative industries in London. Despite tough economic times businesses are showing confidence by continuing to invest in the future of the creative sectors.

“What’s so important about the development of this new creative cluster is the potential it provides for businesses to make new links with each other and take advantage of opportunities to collaborate.”
